This weekend - Remembrance Sunday

Good advice in the gospel today - 'STAY AWAKE' - sounds a bit like the daily pandemic advice we receive — STAY ALERT! The ten bridesmaids that our Lord speaks about in the parable though waiting for the return of the bridegroom - five find themselves unprepared for his arrival. As disciples we want to be ready. This Sunday also marks Remembrance day when we particularly recall the countless men and women who have given their lives in the raging wars and conflicts of the 20th century, plus - before and since. War is an ever present reality. At the 10am on-line Mass we will observe a time of silence, our tribute to the fallen. Throughout the month of November there will be many Masses offered for the 'Holy Souls' - with the Tuesday 9.30am Mass having a special emphasis on the 'faithful departed'.

Locked down! Locked out! Never excluded!

Following the government guidelines, we again find that 'places of worship' are now closed - synagogues, mosques, temples, chapels and church - all of us face the same challenge. Our Catholic bishops have written to the Government asking for the 'evidence' that places of worship are dangerous in terms of the virus spread. Of course - we love our church. We want and we need to be together in the house of the Lord - but we know that the first place for faith and prayer is HOME. Long before the young Jesus started travelling to the temple or participating in synagogue – he would have read the Scriptures and prayed with Mary and Joseph at HOME. The teaching of the Church is full of references to 'the domestic church'. We may be locked down and locked out - but each one of us can 'pack prayer and faith into our homes and hearts'. We can have certain times to reach out to Jesus. We may have preferred devotions. Central must always be the Gospels - even a sentence or two daily makes a big difference. Our Lord is always near and rejoices to hear our praise and our petitions. Perhaps instead of seeing the current time as restraint - we can maybe go 'wider' and deeper.

The Sacrament of Confirmation

We have had to change our original plan to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on the feast of Christ the King (November 22). The proposal now is that Father Michael will confer the Sacrament on Sunday 6 December at 12noon. Now that there are 9 candidates - it is better if they each have only 6 guests to observe COVID guidance. They are an impressive group of young people. Please pray for them and their families.
