25th Sunday of the Year - The parable of the landowner

Jesus wants us to know that the kingdom of heaven is like this landowner. God takes the initiative in seeking us out.

The truth of salvation is that we are 'needed and wanted and loved'. The Father stretches out his embrace to 'hire' us for his purpose and to receive his payment, his recognition and reward. When we make the mistake of thinking that following Jesus is only about our efforts at faith and virtue. No! He comes to find us and to enrol us in discipleship and service. First Holy Communion - 2020

After considerable prayer, discussion and consulting the current Westminster diocese and Government regulations, it is clear that this is not an appropriate time to restart preparation classes for our 6 children whose journey towards making their First Holy Communion was interrupted by the Lockdown in March. The good Lord will surely guide us to a safe and practical time in 2021 when the parish First Holy Communion Programme will be able to take place. We look forward to news of this sometime in the Spring in the Newsletter. Until then, please hold all the young children of the parish in your prayers that we will soon be able to welcome them and their families back into church for Mass and the sacraments. The Sacrament of Confirmation

'Normally' of course the Bishop visits parishes regularly to celebrate the Sacrament of the Holy Spirit. This has not happened anywhere in the diocese for many months since the beginning of lockdown; impossible for four bishops to catch-up. With a huge backlog of parishes and candidates -

the Cardinal has written recently to all Parish Priests delegating them to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation in their own parishes. Here in Stanmore - we had an enrolment of 11 candidates at the beginning of the year. Father Michael will be writing to each of them - asking whether they would be happy to go ahead now or wait in hope of a real, live Bishop next year!??! For those wishing to proceed now- Father Michael has suggested 3 preparation sessions in the church - which would allow 'social distancing'. Father Michael would confer the Sacrament at a date to be fixed - but under COVID restrictions. All 'live events' as they are called in the government guidelines (funerals, weddings, Baptisms, Confirmation etc.) are limited to 30 people in the church. Candidates will have a choice of waiting until 2021 or moving ahead sooner!

Extra collections (and Father David Kolo)

'Normally' throughout the year - in addition to the offertory collection taken up during Mass, there would often be an extra collection at the door (e.g. CAFOD Fast Day, Peter's Pence, Holy Places etc. etc.) These have all been cancelled - though people may wish to contribute directly. The only Diocesan extra collection will be on Sunday 8 November - for 'the sick and retired' priests of the diocese. We remain in contact with Father David who struggles on in Uganda. If you would like to help support Father David - you can place a donation in an envelope marked 'Father David' and drop it into the basket at the church door with the normal collection or perhaps through the front door of the house.
