This weekend - complaints and signs

In the gospel (again Saint John) the people pursue Our Lord after he speaks about the 'food of eternal life'. They ask for signs; impressive acts to convince! Yet 5000 have been fed. They recall the first reading where the people complained against Moses and Aaron - yet the Old Testament people had also been fed with manna in the desert. It is perfectly possible for all of us to miss the obvious; the signs and blessings which the Lord gives. THE sign and Sacrament for us is the Eucharist; the words of Jesus to us at every Mass "I am the bread of life; the one who comes to me will never be hungry; the one who believes in me will never thirst." Imagine - an endless supply of the bread from heaven. We receive the body of Christ. One of the early fathers/writers of the Church said that- 'in most cases the food we consume becomes part of us but in the reception of Holy Communion, we BECOME part of the food we receive - the Body of Christ'.

Readers: Arrangements for Readers Rota from September

For the benefit of Readers unable to attend the meeting on 17 July - new Rota arrangements will commence from September, when the names of Readers will be listed in the weekly newsletter, giving 3 weeks' notice of when you are required to read. The new Rota will cover ALL weekend Masses. New/old Readers are requested to text Alec Moody 07860 622831 with your name and the time of Mass you are able to attend and read at. There will be no change to weekday Masses.

We need 2 new readers for the 8am Mass on Sunday.

Readers are expected to attend Mass to read from the lectern.

The Responsorial Psalm – Readers should not announce 'The Responsorial Psalm is!!!' - conclude the first reading, pause a moment then continue with the Psalm, starting with the response. Those readers who have not been commissioned should ask Fr. Michael to enrol them as Ministers of the Word.

The feast of the Transfiguration – this Friday-7pm Mass

Every Friday we have our 7pm Mass. For some weeks- we have had Eucharistic Adoration before Mass starting at 6.30pm. This is a wonderful opportunity to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament- the 'bread of life'. This coming Friday- we will celebrate Jesus, revealing Himself as the Son of God- to Peter, James and John. Accept the invitation of Christ on this Friday evening. There will be an opportunity for Confession after Mass.

Now we can sing!

It is great that congregational singing in church is now possible. Singing brings us together but above all gathers us in praise to the Lord. Good old Saint Augustine wrote that 'he/she who sings prays TWICE'. We will try to provide words for some known hymns and choruses. Our hefty hymn books are sealed in the church. Please join in where you can. Thank you.

Now we could restore our previous way of taking up the offertory collection!

"It would now be permissible to return to our usual practice - passing the bag or basket along the line, one person to the other. However, for the time being until the end of August, we will continue to simply have the 'offertory collection' baskets at the door. Thank you for providing some regular parish income - along with others who have made banking arrangements. However - I would like to restore the offertory procession at weekends - carrying the gifts of bread and wine to the altar. (Father Michael)

Now - for the time being - we will continue to use masks in church!

This, of course, is no longer a legal requirement. It can only be a suggestion. For the time being and out of caution for ourselves and others - we will continue to observe this recommendation.
