The second Sunday of Lent: there in their presence He was transfigured

Do I really believe that God can change what I see, what I hear and how I behave? In the Genesis reading today, Abraham hears the voice of God making an extreme demand. Anyone else might have refused and escaped elsewhere. Not Abraham- rightly called 'our father in faith'. In the gospel-the three apostles see the transfigured Jesus, causing them to be both afraid and yet willing to follow him more deeply. Our Lord really can change our 'seeing, listening and actions'. He can take us beyond our limitations and truly 'transfigure us'. We listen to the voice of the Father who says "This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to Him.'
