# This weekend - 'God does not have favourites'

Saint Peter in the first reading, once again the ACTS of the Apostles - makes this startling assertion! It was startling because Peter and the others around him, all faithful Jews, believed that God, in some sense, did have favourites - namely the CHOSEN Jewish race. For Peter in the first reading today - to proclaim that 'anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him' was a full turn-around! Saint Paul took it further in his missionary travels and preaching. In this weekend's gospel - Jesus tells his disciples (and us) 'I do not call you servants and more; I call you FRIENDS' and gives his great command of love. Dear people of God - in the presence and teaching of Jesus, our status is made clear. Our good shepherd, the true vine of which we are the branches – has called and sealed us as his very own. Once again, for me - the response to the psalm sums it up - 'The Lord has shown His salvation to the nations' (Father Michael)

# Diamond Jubilee of the opening of our parish church

7 May 1961 was a wonderful day for our parish! The then Archbishop of Westminster, Cardinal William Godfrey, solemnly opened our 'new church' after many years when Mass was celebrated in the Dominican convent and school opposite our present building. It was a wonderful day - with a great deal of hard-work, preparation and fund-raising over the years beforehand. Prompted and reminded by parishioners with good memories - I had booked the present Archbishop of Westminster - Cardinal Vincent Nichols to celebrate Mass in Stanmore - this Sunday 9 May. He had kindly agreed. Present circumstances and other issues meant that the visit by the present Cardinal has now being POSTPONED until the projected work in the church is complete and things are a bit more 'normal'. Still 60 years is a milestone and we will give thanks this weekend.
