Confession: the Sacrament of Repentance

Father Michael writes- "If it is more than two months since your last Confession - you are really MISSING OUT!!! The Lord through the CHURCH has given us this wonderful Sacrament. You have heard me say many times before that all that we need to do is 'to turn up and own up'. We don't have to get the formula right (so don't worry if you can't remember 'how'). Sometimes we might feel a little embarrassed. Even though we are adults, we find ourselves presenting the same list of sins that we named at our first Confession. The Lord only asks us to have an honest disposition. The traditional examination of conscience before Confession - asks us to examine our thoughts, words and deeds - 'in what I have done and in what I have failed to do'. THOUGHTS can be toxic in different ways - e.g. resentment, mild or even strong attacks of hatred against individuals, groups, races or others. THOUGHTS can lock us into impurity or self-regard. WORDS can be cruel, false, lies, manipulation. In preparing for Confession, MY own experience is that - it is vital that I visit every corner of my soul. I can't be too slippery with the Lord. DEEDS cover so many areas of life - especially the way I treat others. When Jesus said that our good DEEDS should shine out with the brightness of faith he both challenges us and reassures us. Each Saturday from 10.30am I am in our church/hall. The Lord wants to share his profound mercy. In HIS name - I invite YOU to receive his powerful forgiveness."

The month of November – remembering the faithful departed

November is a deeply Catholic month. It starts with the feast of ALL SAINTS; that day when we remember and honour, not only the officially canonised saints in the Church's calendar – but also the vast army of 'anonymous' saints. We have all known and met saints. They include family members and relatives, friends and loved ones, neighbours and parishioners, clergy and others; those many good people of all ages who, having completed their time on earth, have now taken their place in the heavenly kingdom. We turn to them in our daily lives and they are able to accompany us. The whole remaining month of November is dedicated to **the faithful departed** who are still, after death, completing their journey into the full presence of God. On November 2nd – we keep **ALL SOULS DAY** and begin a month of masses for our remembered dead. Our long Catholic tradition gives us an opportunity to prepare our HOLY SOULS LISTS. We have our customary 'lists' available and envelopes - at the door of the church. Please write

down the names of your departed. Place the list and offering in the HOLY SOULS envelope. There is a special basket for the envelopes. Through the month of November Masses will be offered for the names on our parish HOLY SOULS lists.

On Tuesday 2nd November (All Souls Day) Masses will be at 9.30am and **7pm**. The evening **7pm** Mass will be offered for all those who have lost their lives because of COVID.
