REFLECTIONS on today's scriptures We stand at the threshold of Christmas on this Sunday which is at the same time the fourth in Advent and Christmas Eve. We encounter King David (of whom, according to the genealogists, Jesus was a direct descendent): David imagined he could do something for God - build Him a permanent dwelling at the centre of Jerusalem. His success as monarch went to his head and he forgot his humble origins as a shepherd boy. He was denied his desire. By contrast, in Luke's Gospel, we see an Israelite girl who is fully aware of who she is before God; and it is her humility that enables her to do something very great for God. The promise made to David in the grandeur of his palace centuries before would now be fulfilled because a low-born girl had an extra-ordinary openness to God. Despite what the imagination of countless has done to embellish and elaborate on the story of Mary, there is very little majesty in the Christmas narrative. Its power comes from its simplicity and humility: the gifts we need to appreciate its good news.

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7.1-5, 8-12, 16 David was Israel's first successful king. Given that, as king, he lived in a palace, so a Temple should be constructed as God's dwelling place. Before David made Jerusalem his capital, the Ark of the Covenant (the place of God's presence among His people) had been housed in a tent. God literally travelled with his people through all their ups and downs. Indeed, God had other plans:

The Archbishop's Council discussed how our diocese can support the needs in Israel-Palestine, and the cardinal wrote to say:

For more see https://rcdow.org.uk/pilgrimages/lourdes/ it was He who would build *David* a 'house' – the House of David: descendants to rule in Israel. This promise took on great significance for the Jews after the monarchy had died out and they lived for 600 years under foreign (pagan) rulers. The people began to look forward to a messiah: God's anointed David's descendant, Israel's deliverer. The new testament regularly points out that Jesus is of David's house and line.

Second Reading: Romans 16.25–7 Paul gives praise to God for Jesus who reveals the plan of God which had for so long been hidden. Now the plan was clear to all, and it included the salvation of everyone. This insight is a cause of great joy to Paul and is the driving force in his ministry. It shows that God's wisdom is far beyond any human philosophy or strategy; and is the cause of our praise of the Almighty.

Gospel: Luke 1.26–38 John the Baptist dominates the stage first in Advent, but in its closing days Mary moves centre stage. She occupies a greater place in Luke's Gospel than in any other. While it is just as possible of St John's Gospel, Christian tradition has it that Luke knew Mary in her old age and that she told him her story. Mary's openness to the Spirit of God opens the way for God to come into the flesh of the world. And that is how Luke presents our discipleship in his gospel. God will work in the world whenever Jesus's followers open themselves, in an attitude of faith, to the work of his Spirit.
