Reflect on next week's readings (2 Kings 4.8-16; Romans 6.3-4, 8-11; Matthew 10.37-42) with the help of wednesdayword.org A WARM WELCOME to Mass today, especially if you are new or an occasional worshipper. Please take this newsletter home and use the calendar to help your daily prayer.

• **BEFORE all Sunday Masses**, a prayer before worship: ALMIGHTY GOD, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. *Please keep <u>silence</u> until the Mass begins*.

• The ORDER of Mass is in the orange Parish Mass Book. Start on p.7; then, after the Creed, go to p.15; and then, at the Lord's Prayer, go to p.56.

• Today's readings are to be found pp.94—96. And the psalm response is, 'In your great love answer me O God.'

**REFLECTIONS on today's Scriptures** The first three centuries of Christian history are often referred to as the Age of Martyrs, yet even when the Emperor Diocletian (+305) launched a full scale persecution only small sections of the Church were affected. Today, alas, outbursts of violent persecution against Christian communities, particularly in the Middle East but also elsewhere, are not uncommon. 'In 2022, advocacy group Open Doors said that at least 360 million Christians experienced "high levels of persecution and discrimination." 20 million higher than 2021. The group also estimated that the number of Christians killed for their faith rose to 5,898 in 2022, up from 4,761 in 2021.' The Middle East, Nigeria, and North Korea saw the highest rates of persecution globally. (Source: The House of Commons Library online) The work of Aid to the Church in Need and the Gateshead Institute (check them both online) give adequate testimony. Behind persecution is the far wider issue of religious freedom. How the churches were treated in lock-down has deeply divided Christian opinion. We live in an open and generally tolerant society, yet many issues of public debate, policy and legislation trouble the Christian conscience. Some are irreconcilable with Catholic faith or Christian conviction. While we must not minimize the reality of others' persecution it also takes courage



to raise our Christian voice here – at school, university, work, social settings, wherever. And that is the issue which is at the heart of today's readings. The prophet Jeremiah is pained by the plots of his enemies; St Paul writing to the Christians in the capital of the Roman empire is candid about sin; and Jesus warns his disciples of the (unavoidable) conflict that will confront any commitment to the kingdom of God.

**First reading (OT): Jeremiah 20.10–13** Jeremiah suffered what we might now call a mobbing. Normally speaking, someone in such a situation might hope s/he has friends to call on for support. Jeremiah, however, turns to God. God would not abandon him. Today many with difficulties turn to professional therapists or organisations

**20th June** every year is World Refugee Day, one of the 'awareness days' kept by international bodies across the world. 2.8% of the world's entire population are refuges or migrants – more than twice the population of the UK! Refugee Week is an initiative founded in the UK. The theme for this years' Refugee Week is *compassion*, which Pope Francis has called 'the language of God' and 'the path of true justice'. The reality of sin is recognised as having infected all of humanity, and yet through the coming of the new man (and the sacrificial death he endured on the cross) the consequences of human sin have been repaired and redemption has been secured.

**Gospel: Matthew 10.26–33** As if he could foresee how much his disciples would suffer for their fidelity to his teaching, Jesus counsels them to have no fear.
