

A WARM WELCOME to Mass today, especially if you are new to the parish. **Please take this newsletter home** and use the calendar in your daily prayer.

• Before Mass, when the tower bell rings, pray together: ALMIGHTY GOD, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Please, let's now keep <u>silence</u> until Mass begins.

• Parents and carers please do what you need to keep children content and quiet. Do not hesitate to move around at the back of the church. (The service is amplified into the Narthex too.) And, for everybody's safety, *please accompany* any child who needs to use the toilet. Thanks.

• GIVE for GAZA: a plea from 'Embrace the Middle East'. If you missed last week's opportunity to contribute to the donation to help the Christian parishes and institutions in Gaza in the midst of the present this crisis for humanity, you can still do so. • Today's readings are to be found on pp.152-54 of the Parish Mass Book. The psalm response is: 'For You my soul is thirsting, O God, my God.'

• **AFTER the 10am Mass** Drinks and often cakes, and *always* a chance to catch up and share fellowship.

REFLECTIONS on today's scriptures This Sunday's Liturgy invites us consider eternal life. On this point there is a clear difference between those who hope and those who don't. The Book of Wisdom says, 'Be alert for wisdom, and anxiety will soon leave you.' St Paul said to the Thessalonians: 'Don't remain in the dark about those who have died! Don't grieve like those who have no hope.' (4.13) He later reminded the Christians of Ephesus that before accepting the Good News they themselves 'had no hope, and were without God in the world' (Eph 2.12). The ancient pagan cults and myths, were unable to shed any light on the mystery of death; thus an ancient inscription said: 'How quickly we fall back from nothing to nothing.' If we remove God, we remove Christ and the world falls back into emptiness and darkness. It is a very clear contemporary problem-often unconscious-and unfortunately, touches the lives of a great many young people.

Today's Gospel is a famous parable that speaks of 10 maidens invited to a wedding feast: the key symbol of heaven and eternal life (Mt 25.1-13). It is a joyful image, but through

it Jesus teaches a truth that *challenges us personally*. In fact 5 maidens were admitted to the feast because they had brought oil for their lamps, but the other 5 were left outside because they were foolish enough not to have. What <u>is</u> this 'oil' that's so important for admission to heaven?

St Augustine and other ancient Christian writers interpreted the oil as a symbol of love which we can't buy,

Prayer for Israel–Gaza Mother of God and our Mother, Queen of Peace, we appeal for peace in the Holy Land! Touch the hearts of those imprisoned by hatred; turn those who fuel and foment conflict. Dry the tears of children and grieving parents – so many are weeping! Be present to the elderly; strengthen the wounded and the sick; protect those forced to leave their lands and their loved ones; give grace to every need. Through Christ our Lord.

Peace in Ukraine Mother of God, Our Lady of Kiev, intercede for the people of Ukraine and their government, and all who suffer as a result of war. Be with them as you stood by your Son. Give them strength and courage through faith, hope and justice. May we in our turn support them through prayer and generosity: so that lives may be saved, injuries healed, the dead may rest in peace, and there will be just peace after war. Through Christ our Lord.

Why not dive deeper this year, buy a Gospel commentary and get to know the gospel as a *whole book*, not just weekly readings? Suggestions of what you might get, in next week's newsletter.

Weekly Almsgiving It is our aim to give an account of weekly collections and planned giving so that the parish has a clearer picture of our financial situation, which we shall have to address in the coming year. which we're given, which we keep safe within, and use in charitable actions. True wisdom is making the most of earthly life with such acts of mercy, since, after death this will no longer be possible. Our personal judgement will be on the basis of how in this world we used the love that the Holy Spirit poured into us. Such love gives hope – like a lamp gives light through the night leading us to 'the Supper of the Lamb'.

No Christians in the Holy land? In 100 years the Christian population of Palestine has, astonishingly, fallen from 28% to 2%. Even before the present war, violence and oppression had caused Christians to migrate. The land so precious to the world-Church may soon be devoid of native Christians. Week-long votive lamps From Advent Sunday, 3 Dec, we shall launch a new prayer initiative here that happens in many other parishes. A week-long lamp ($\pounds 10$ per lamp) will burn for your intentions in one of three places: the altar of Our Lady, or in the Sanctuary. The intention will appear in the Newsletter. Separate envelopes will be available.
