This weekend is Good Shepherd Sunday, Easter 4, and includes the annual second collection for our diocesan Priest Training Fund, that is the fund that supports your future priests. At present, for this Diocese, we have 14 men across 6 years of formation, and 2 more preparing to begin. On average it



costs about \pounds 25,000 per year to educate, prepare and house one seminarian. Your future parish priests must come from somewhere!

Please be generous; show our seminarians they are wanted and supported; and show God you want the Church to be resilient, led by good and selfless clergy.

REFLECTIONS on today's scriptures

The shepherds were the first outsiders to visit the infant lesus in the stable at Bethlehem. It was with them that News of the birth of a Saviour was first shared. Even if shepherds were not highly regarded by the lewish society of Jesus' day, they would have been a familiar sight, and everyone knew they served an important task. The Jewish people nomadic in their origins, and their great spiritual leaders -Abraham, Moses and David - were all cast by providence in the role of shepherd. The psalm which has become best known in the Christian tradition but was also frequently recited by devout Israelites cast God as shepherd: The Lord is my shepherd, so I can want for nothing!' (Ps. 22, 1). This weekend lesus presents himself as the Good Shepherd of all.

We are challenged during Eastertide to understand how the risen Lord makes himself present in the world, by means of His Church. One way is to unite people, both to God and to one another, by guiding them as a shepherd conserves the unity of a flock. So, we're invited to pray that pastors may be provided to serve Christ as shepherds on His flock. In many respects, as parents, friends, elders, spiritual guides, confidantes, peacemakers, we can serve as guides for one another and those coming to faith – so long as we are ministering *Christ's teaching and love*, not our own philosophies.

But to animate the Church, serving Christ in the midst of Christ's body, the Church needs dedicated pastors, wellprepared for this role. There is an idea among English Catholics that priests come from *elsewhere*, that they grow on trees, and will be *provided*. They don't; they won't. It is from our *midst* that the Lord raises up men to serve in this way.

First Reading (NT): Acts of the Apostles

4.8–12 Peter, who had only recently denied Jesus, comes out very strongly in proclaiming the risen Jesus as a *unique* Saviour. He says, very pointedly, to the listening Israelites – leaders and ordinary people alike – that the man they had rejected in favour of Barabbas, God had raised up as their Saviour! As proof, the man born lame, who sat for years at the 'Beautiful' Gate of the Temple, had been healed through Jesus' power, not Peter's. This is the task of the Church today.

Second Reading (NT): I John 3.1–2 St

John makes the same point: Jesus is the unique Saviour. Obey His (your shepherd's) commands and God's love will be perfected in you. Don't, and it won't.

Gospel: John 10.11-18 Jesus appears to His disciples. Again that mixture of factors when the risen Victim appears: recognition, terror, the assurance of peace, the mandate to expand the message that is central to the Resurrection: the forgiveness of sins.

• Confirmation Alongside our first communion group, a group of adult and teenage confirmation candidates begin their preparation this week. Over the next eight weeks, meeting each Tuesday, they will be thinking and praying hard with Fr Jonathan about receiving this sacrament that seals their life with the presence of the 'inseparable' Holy Spirit. Please pray for them.
