

REFLECTIONS on today's scriptures

Human beings are extremely well-researched creatures, and not least our psyche and relationships. Part of such research is of course on the patterns of our grief, how we deal with loss, and how we change to cope with the absence of those whom we love. It is possible that some Christians cope with grief and loss differently to others, especially those who remember Paul's advice to the Thessalonians: "Do not mourn like those who have no hope" (I Thess 4.13). But there is for all human beings a deep solidarity in remembering those who have shaped, even defined, our lives.

On the evening of Easter Day, the disciples were hiding together for fear of being seen. No doubt it was also a comfort too, to mourn Jesus, despite the disturbing stories from the women. And into this shared space, He came ...

First Reading: Acts 4.32–35 The small Christian communities which quickly emerged all across modern-day Turkey and the Aegean, drew the attention of their neighbours. The early Christian writer Tertullian claimed, sometimes with sarcasm and sometimes with admiration, that they were spoken of as 'those who love one another.' The impression we form may be idealised (which is perhaps an indicator of our own cynicism) but the image is at all times of a community which, as a consequence of celebra-

ting the Eucharist is filled with the grace of *caritas* — specifically *caritas* — meaning both in Latin charity and love towards others.

Second Reading (NT): I John 5.1-6 lesus had insisted on charity as his disciples' primary obligation to others - always drew attention to the obligation of his disciples to love their neighbours as themselves. John here, as elsewhere, makes it perfectly clear the test of whether we are charitable to others is if we are doing what God commands. Not (you notice) the other way round: not our love of others being our proof of our love of God. We cannot recommend ourselves to God by being busy loving others. We can only truly love others out of humble obedience to God.

Gospel: John 20.19–31 Thomas's problem was not that he doubted Jesus – the jury was out on the question of the day. No, his problem was that he doubted the testimony of others. He missed out on the first apparitions of

Jesus, on Easter day itself, and could not accept second-hand reports. He would trust only his own touch and sight. And for that Jesus rebukes him: happy are others (like you and me!) who haven't seen and yet have believed other people's witness.
